Q-01 Section 5.9.3 of the draft AO states that NASA will communicate, no later than the release of the final AO, the decision to supply either 1 Next-Gen RTG or up to 2 MMRTGs; however, Section 5.2.4.1 states that MMRTGs are not planned to be offered under the New Frontiers 5 AO. Could you please clarify?

The language in Section 5.9.3 is the correct language: "Two technologies are under consideration for electrical power: the Multi-Mission Radioisotope Thermoelectric Generator (MMRTG) and the Next Generation Radioisotope Thermoelectric Generator (RTG). Up to two MMRTG units or a single Next Generation RTG unit will be made available to proposers. Only one of these technologies will be offered, and NASA will communicate its decision no later than the release of the final New Frontiers 5 AO."

## Q-02 When will the contents of the Program Library be posted?

NASA intends to begin populating the Program Library in the April time frame. Documents will be placed in the Program Library as decisions are finalized and documents become available, with priority given to documents that are critical to proposers and unique to the New Frontiers 5 AO (e.g., launch vehicle information is a higher priority to post than NASA policy documents that are available elsewhere).
